Location

Programs are available on three ASU campuses in the Phoenix metro area, locations across the state with school district and community college partners, or online.



Speed

As an Education Studies major, you can earn both your bachelor's degree and master's degree in just five years with our accelerated 4+1 program. Or, as a student in teacher certification programs, you can earn both your degree and certification in just four years.



Majors

Add a teaching certificate to your bachelor's degree while you complete another major at ASU, such as biology or English.

Depending on the program you choose, classes may be available online or in the evening.

You'll be ready

MLFTC Professional Pathways provides internships and residencies designed to expose you to more ways of teaching, learning and working. Our teambased approach has students working with both peers and seasoned professionals.

If you're in a teacher-certification program, you'll work with peers in schools on teams led by certified Lead Teachers. Every team, in turn, works with the support of an ASU faculty member called a Site Lead.

The goal is to empower you by introducing you to more modes of professional collaboration and problem-solving while offering you as much support as possible.

No two students are the same. Our full-time student success team tailors support to meet your individual goals and needs.

















Academic support

Our academic coaches help with time management, study habits, and writing and math skills. They can also help you explore study abroad opportunities and other steps along your path to graduation.

Financial counseling

Our financial coaches work with you to strengthen and support your financial literacy. That includes hosting financial aid workshops for you and your parents — including sessions on how to manage student debt — and how to reduce it by filling out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid and applying for scholarships, loans and grants.

Wellness coaching

Being a full-time student doesn't mean being a student all the time. Sometimes you have to ride a bike, talk to a friend, try a new club or get out to enjoy an event on campus. Our wellness team helps with holistic wellness, stress management, conflict resolution and other aspects of life beyond academics.

Career development

Need help with a resume or cover letter? Have questions about internships? Uncertain about what is next? Our career development team offers individual career development coaching on career planning, career paths and so much more.

Support is about finding connection where you need it. We'll help you build your own personal system of support through student clubs, organizations, honor societies and Greek life. Our MLFTC advisors are here to help with a variety of needs.

Paying for college

There are many ways to reduce the cost of college, including scholarships and grants just for education students.

Arizona Teachers Academy Scholarships

This scholarship covers tuition and fees for students who commit to teaching in an Arizona public school after graduation. It's awarded to Arizona residents who are juniors or seniors in programs leading to initial teacher certification.

MLFTC scholarships

Donors make college a reality for many of our students. Eligibility requirements for scholarships vary and include merit, financial need, an application essay and specific academic criteria. A scholarship portal for undergraduates allows you to submit one online application to apply for multiple scholarships.

TEACH grant

The federal TEACH grant — Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education — provides up to \$4,000 per year while you complete your degree if you agree to teach a high-needs subject area in a public or private elementary or secondary school that serves students from low-income families after graduation.

Arizona Teacher Loan Forgiveness

The Math, Science and Special Education Teacher Loan Forgiveness Program is offered by the state of Arizona for college juniors and seniors entering the teaching profession in Arizona public schools.
